

**UNDP and CHCA Continue
to Counter COVID-19 in IDP
Collective Centres**

20 June - International Refugee / Internally Displaced Persons Day

There are 411 derelict Collective Centers in Georgia, where approximately 40,000 IDPs live in unsafe environments. These hazards have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, where an outbreak within a Collective Center could endanger the entire resident population. CHCA and UNDP have taken steps to help the Collective Center residents.



Khidistavi Collective Center

IDPs have been living in the Village of Khidistavi Collective Center since 1993, housed in a former professional school. 25 families live in the Khidistavi Collective Center, including 4 from Abkhazia and the rest from the Tskhinvali area. CHCA provided sanitation products to the community leader to clean the common areas within the Collective Center. Emzar Chochua, Khidistavi Collective Center Community Leader noted that: "These tools are very important, and I was glad to receive them from [CHCA]. Independently, I will be able to disinfect the building. COVID-19 has caused significant harm to everyone. The main income of the residents here are social assistance and IDP allowance."



UNDP and CHCA visited IDPs living in a Gori Collective Center

33 IDP families have been living in Gori, all of whom are from Samachablo, in the Tskhinvali area. The Collective Center is on Chonkadze St., within the former Musical School, and has operating there since 2009. Two of the main issues concerning IDPs is unemployment, and a sharp housing shortage. Louisa Winton, the head of the UNDP Georgia office, talked to the resident IDPs and noted the mentioned problems and challenges. Ms. Winton was hosted by Nukri Milorava, Executive Director of CHCA.

Twelve extremely vulnerable families living in the Collective Center were provided with essential foods and the Collective Center was provided with sanitation products for cleaning common areas.



Manual Sprayers for Sanitation were distributed in the IDP Collective Centers

At 25 Collective Centers in Shida Kartli, Community Leaders were provided with Manual Sprayers, which will enable them to independently undertake disinfection activities in Collective Centers.

Of the 291,000 IDPs in Georgia, only 50% were provided with long-term housing. Many within the IDP community still face problems and challenges in Collective Centres.

There are 411 decrepit buildings which reside within Georgia's cities and villages, which house approximately 40,000 IDPs. These are the Collective Centers, where IDPs live in unsafe conditions.

Trainings have resumed at the Livelihood Development Center (LDC)



The Livelihood Development Center (LDC) has restarted training seminars after a 2-month hiatus caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. For the past two months, only seminars on COVID-19 Prevention were held within the LDC, so that key personnel could gain effective training in pandemic management.

In June, the LDC conducted seminars on three topics:

- Modern Horticultural Technologies
- Graphic Design through CorelDraw
- Current issues of Herding



Shelter for the Elderly Home Without Borders Khurvaleti, Gori



Representatives of CHCA and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) visited the Khurvaleti Elderly Shelter. The Head of the House, Luda Salia, showed the Representatives around the shelter and discussed the current situation, challenges, and future plans. UNDP donated sanitation products to the home to counter COVID-19.
