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40,000 Families in Georgia live in Hazardous Environments



IDPs Received Food Supplies - Zugdidi

CHCA delivered basic food supplies to 150 IDP families living in the IDP Collective Center in Zugdidi and Poti. CHCA determined the families most in need through a survey, focusing on two main criteria 1. The number of family members and socioeconomic status. 2. Family dependence on social services. CHCA Staff surveyed 500 families, and the ones most in need will receive the most assistance.

Qeti Qimosteli, CHCA Social Program Manager, noted:

"Most of the IDPs in our target collective centres live in poverty, and all of these families need urgent help. However, we are limited in resources, and we can only help four categories of extremely vulnerable groups: disabled people, older people living alone, pregnant women and mothers of infants, and people with chronic illnesses. During the survey, when we asked whether a respondent or a family member had been hungry in the last 3-12 months, most of the respondents said that they had."

CHCA Implements Preventative Measures to Counter COVID-19 in IDP Collective Centers

As IDP community leaders work to respond to COVID-19 in collective centres, CHCA Staff has provided supplies to assist with sterilization. CHCA has provided kits with disinfectant solution, manual sprayers, and protective equipment, and has trained IDP community leaders in pandemic management.




Loan Committee Approves 15 Entrepreneurs for Interest-Free Loans of up to 5,000 GEL



CHCA's interest-free loan committee evaluated 29 business proposals from entrepreneurs living in Samegrelo and Shida Kartli. 15 proposals were approved, and those businesses will receive up to 5000 GEL in interest-free loans. Business Proposals were mainly in the Agriculture Industry and the Service Industry.

IDPs' Living Condition in Tskaltubo

Natela Kopaliani:
"I have not come down from my room for 12 years. I had a stroke years ago, and I find it difficult to move."



IDPs from Abkhazia have been living in a former Tsalktubo sanatorium Samguruli for 28 years. There are 120 families who live in the collective centre, and the living conditions of the IDPs are harsh. The elevator does not work in the multi-story building, and the families live in small spaces. They have a bedroom, kitchen, and living room in the same area.

Natela Kopaliani, 81, lives in Tskaltubo. She has not left her apartment for 12 years. She has lived in the former sanatorium since 1992, and she remembers November 4 well, the day they were brought into this building. She has many problems with health and finances and like most others, she is hoping for an apartment in a new settlement.
